We would like everyone to wear a name tag so that we know who you are when you come to a meeting. Let our membership person know which type you would like (see samples at the check in table)


Special Interest Group

Ancestry.com Adds Huge New Content Addition for More Recent Years

The following was written by Gary Gibb and published on the Ancestry.com Blog:

We are launching huge new content additions over the next few weeks. We are excited because it helps provide records from 1935 to today. We have great census and vital records from 1930 and before but more recent records are difficult to acquire. These new records are being provided in 4 major releases.

First, we launched a **1940 census substitute**. This is a project that we have been working on for years. Since we can't get the real 1940 census until 2012 we have pulled together a huge collection of city directories from about 1935 to 1945. This collection has over 100 million names and covers most of the US.

Second, we will launch in the next week (or two) the first ever collection of **U.S. Public Records (USPRI) database** with more than 525 million names, addresses, ages, and possible family relationships of people who lived in the United States between roughly 1950 and 1990. This will be an invaluable tool in piecing together family stories and histories. This new addition will replace the current USPRI database on Ancestry which is mainly profiles of living people. This database is built from a variety of city directories and other public records.

Third, we launched search results and links to **living** people records on MyLife.com. We are excited about this partnership because MyLife has a much better collection of records about living people and continues to update this collection. MyLife.com includes current public information and more than 700 million profiles of living people. They are much better

equipped to offer these services than we are. If you want to find a living cousin or second cousin or other living relative we believe these links to MyLife will be the best service to help you contact your family.

Finally, we launched a **new obituary collection**. We have had several very popular obituary collections for several years. We have now upgraded our collection that we extract from obituaries posted in newspapers around the world with much better fielding and from more papers. This should help you more easily identify the right obituary and find family relationships.

In the coming months look for additional significant improvements to all the US Federal Census from 1800 to 1890. We will also continue to release millions of vital records every month. We are also excited about the upcoming large addition to our newspaper and military collections over the next few months.

We hope these additions help you discover more of your family story.

From the editor's desk...

What software are you using to collect, index, sort, store, and share your data? I would like to put a list of our favorite software up on our web page. Would you be interested in mentoring others that would like to try your favorites? Let me share one of my favorites right now. It's a graphics program called GIMP (The GNU Image Manipulation Program). Sure you can go out and spend upwards of \$700 for Photoshop, but why would you when GIMP is free? Yes 100% free! Photoshop used to be my go-to image editing software but now I prefer GIMP! It is every bit as powerful as the other packages out there (including Photoshop). What does a graphics manipulation program have to do

what does a graphics manipulation program have to do with genealogy? Well my main use in the realm of genealogy/family history is fixing old family photos and drawings. That being said is there any interest for a special interest group (SIG) dealing with the preservation of old family photos and documents? This could include converting images and documents to digital media, editing of said documents, and storing/caring for priceless originals. Think it over and contact me via email, phone, or at one of our meetings.

Proposed Legislation on Historic Cemeteries in Washington State/SB 5178

Please note a bill has recently been sponsored in the Washington State Senate by Senator Mary Margaret Haugen (Camano Island) that would provide funds to the DAHP for a grant program for historic and abandoned cemeteries.

The bill requests a \$40,000 appropriation so DAHP could make small grants (~\$1500) to assist local governments and local groups to repair, restore, and rehabilitate abandoned and historic cemeteries in need.

The contribution of volunteers to the welfare of our local societies is crucial in keeping our organizations operating smoothly. In 2003 the Washington State Genealogical Society established a program to recognize these outstanding people from your organization as well as others from around the state. During our annual meeting and conference in Spokane on Sept. 12, 2009, we are again going to recognize people in two categories.

The first award is designed for an individual who has demonstrated outstanding Society Support and Management. We would like your society to select an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to the operation and well being of your local society. This could be a person who always is willing to help with projects, works on committees or subcommittees to help manage your organization, consistently provides informative presentations at meetings, organizes your annual seminar or perhaps makes a special effort to arrive early at every meeting to set up the tables and chairs or prepare the refreshments.

The second award is for outstanding effort in local Records Preservation. We ask you to choose one individual who has conducted a records preservation project of local and statewide significance for your This is the person who has looked for important records of genealogical value, has helped transcribe or publish records either in print or digital format, has indexed historical books or records to simplify research, or has in some other way preserved information which otherwise might have remained hidden or lost to other researchers. It is often impossible to single out one person for recognition when the society support effort or records preservation project is the result of exceptionally close teamwork. If you need, you can recognize two or three individuals for their joint work in either area.

It is our hope you will recognize an individual in each category from your society every year, although we understand there may be years when you do not have anyone working on a records preservation project. It is our intent to recognize these individuals at our annual meeting and conference, and present them with a certificate of appreciation. If these individuals attend the meeting, we will ask them to stand and be recognized by their peers. Please note this is not a competition. Each person you choose to honor WILL receive a certificate. Please send the names of your special members along with their city of residence and a summary of their outstanding accomplishments (not more than 125 words please) in the style shown in the examples. (Suggested form language is underlined in the examples.) We would request you include maiden names for any females and we would like a head-and-shoulders photo of each person (or team) in digital format which will appear on the certificate.

To allow time for us to put the certificates together before the next annual meeting on May 10 in Mt. Vernon, please send us the information and photos, electronically if possible, by July 1, 2009.
