We will also accept funds or a donation of a laptop computer. Our Publications Committee would like to begin extracting some of our Skagit County records that are rapidly deteriorating.

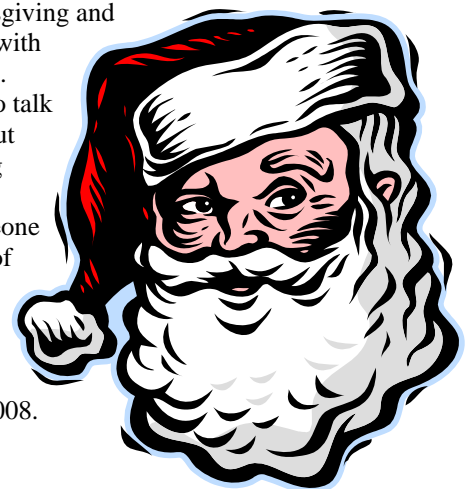

Comb Binding ...

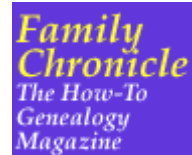

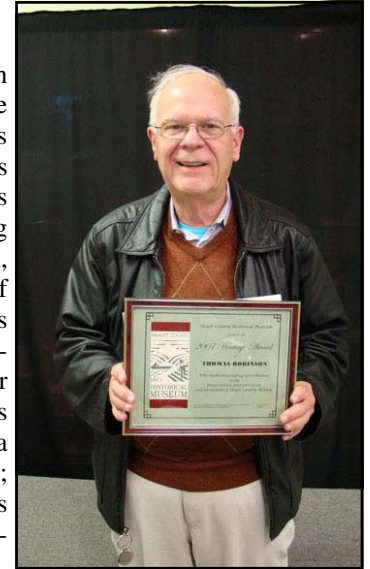

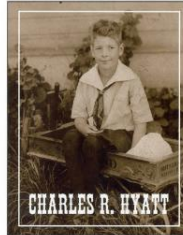
Tom Robinson receives 2007 Heritage Award

Great news for researchers using microfilm or microfiche! A new lens has been donated for this machine by Technology Unlimited, Inc. Sales Representative, Roger Evans. Installed on November 5 the Library Director, Christine Perkins was delighted to have this addition ready to go for genealogists. Now a full page can be seen and printed out which was not available with the original lens. If you want to find out info about Connecticut and New England, the Barbour Vital Records - all 17 rolls - are ready to go.

Microfiche of the IGI from 1992 of the U. S. and a few countries are also ready to be accessed. Several CD's from the Family Tree collection have been donated to our CD collection. Anyone checking these out will need to have Family Tree already installed on their computer. Society members may check out CD's and Video tapes in the usual way, the books are located in the bottom drawer of the Media section.

A few both new and gently used books have been added to our collection since last reported. Gene Ewert was a visitor from Nebraska to our genealogical library last month and he donated his family history to our Society collection. Many of his ancestors records are in Skagit County. This is located in the Family History section located in the file drawers since it is a slim comb bound volume. Three books about Whidby Island came to us from Shirley Christensen - By Canoe & Sailing Ship They Came, DeJa Views, a Historical Pictorial and Whidby Island Memories, a book in two parts. All three have lots of black & white pictures and people named. John Hayes gave a Whatcom County book, Looking Back Vol. 2 published in 1982 with black & white photos of the Bellingham area in its early days and an index of names.

New books include: A History of Samish Island, just published in 2007, and The Post Card Collection of two sisters, H.R. and R. E. Livingston, a delightful collection of colored cards (both sides) from the early 1900's compiled by John Mattson, 2006. New books are featured on top of the filing cabinets. Stop by your library and look them over.

If you have checked out CD's in the past please look over your collection and see if you have any that belong to the Society. There are three that have been missing for some time: Cemetery Records of Whatcom County #43, Military Records: Civil War Service Records #45 and Passenger and Immigration Lists Index 1500's to 1900's #45.

The Fiske Newsletter is a valuable resource that many researchers have used in the past. It is no longer being mailed to members, rather being accessed online by anyone. The web address is:

This book is a wonderful inspiration, jogging my memory for events and everyday facts as related to myself. How do I remember, and how do I place myself in the context of my everyday life and other worldly events.

Kim is an author, ghostwriter, teacher and owner of Primary Sources. She enjoys writing family stories and helping others to do the same. As a personal historian she has developed and taught a class entitled "You Making History".

This is an excellent outline of topics and world events on which to recall our own history. We are encouraged to write vignettes (notes of interest) and memoirs (short-short stories) of how our lives relate to people, places and events.

With a division of 30-year spans of historical events, divided into three parts and eighteen chapters, this book illustrates some of the reasons to tell your story, with a sharing of stories from some of her students.

The three parts are: (1) Why Tell Your Story; (2) How to Tell Your Story; (3) How Your Story Fits into History.

The eighteen chapters are related to different aspects of our lives as related to personal, social and historical events. Your life has consequences: what you say, think, feel and do. Your life has meaning.

Whether or not you have stories about your own ancestors, you must remember that one day you will be an ancestor. You must tell your stories and place yourself in history.

This book is very thought provoking and comprehensive. It is not a how-to book, but an instructive and interesting way to jog our memories.
