
**Book Report on Internet Genealogy ~Aug/Sept 2016**Net Notes—A look at websites and related news.

New York City Marriage Records Indexes 1908-1929. Reclaim the records, www.reclaintherecords.org, has been working to make vital records from NY and NJ available and accessible to researchers As a result the index to the NY City Clerk's office marriage records ( the application, affidavit and license) for 1908-1929 are online via Internet Archive-where they are free to access. This include: Manhatten, Bronz, Staten Island, Brooklyn and Queens. T http://archive.org/details/nycmarriageindex.
