This is Sharon Jonson one of our founding society members. Our condolences to her family. She was so helpful to many society members in research. She is greatly missed. This is few words from her obituary.

Conway - Sharon Ann Johnson of Conway passed away on June 5, 2021 in Mount Vernon, WA. She was born in Everett, Washington to Algot and Margaret Olson on October 18, 1944.

The family moved to Anacortes, where Sharon attended school, and graduated high school in 1962. She attended Washington State University, graduating in 1966 with her BA in Business Administration. It was there that she met Larry, and they married in October of 1966. Their first home was in Wichita Kansas while Larry was in the Army. In 1969, they moved back to Mount Vernon, and Sharon was a bookkeeper for a men's clothing store. She was a girl scout leader in the 1970s and taught Sunday School at First Baptist Church in Mount Vernon in the 1980's and 90's, where she was also an active member for many years. Sharon hosted an annual Lutefisk dinner for the extended family, being very proud of her Swedish heritage.

In addition to being a much-loved wife, mother and grandmother, ("Grammie") Sharon's other interests included scrapbooking and genealogy. Sharon was involved with the formation of the Skagit Valley Genealogical Society and a lifetime member. She traveled with a small group of friends annually for over 25 years to Salt Lake City, UT for her research.

### Historic Meeting of East Meets West in La Conner, WA

Perhaps not quite as historic an event as the meeting of the eastern and western lines of the transcontinental railroad but nevertheless an exciting occasion of "east meets west" for SVGS took place on July 10, 2021 in La Conner, WA.

For many years on SVGS' membership roster the name Mike Hurley would faithfully be listed. As president of the genealogy society, it concerned me that Mr. Hurley would always remain just a name on a spreadsheet. You see, Mr. Hurley lives in Virginia. "What family story links him to the Skagit Valley? Is there a way to connect SVGS' out of state members to the local members?" these were my frequent questions. It took a pandemic to find an answer.

Fast forward to April 2020. Due to the pandemic SVGS moves the monthly meetings online via Zoom. Much to all of our delight, there was Mike Hurley on screen. From a name on spreadsheet to visible human form. A long-distance member participating, in "real time" (as my engineering husband would say) at an SVGS meeting with local members. This was a first for SVGS! As president of the genealogy society to was at last an answer as to how to connect all our members!

Mr. Hurley proved to be a valuable contributor to our monthly Zoom meetings. Asking questions, presenting a program about his family research from County Cork to Skagit County and generally adding zest and enthusiasm to this new experimental meeting format called Zoom. When SVGS learned Mr. Hurley planned to visit his ancestral La Conner, WA roots, it was exciting news!

On July 10 in La Conner, WA several SVGS members welcomed the Hurley family "home" to Skagit County. After welcomes and introductions we toured the historic sites of La Conner together. The highlight of the tour was stopping at the historic Nevada Bar. This 1890s brick building still stands on the corner of Commercial and First Street. Two generations of Hurley's paused in front of their ancestor's historic property and savored the moment of connection while camera shutter's clicked.

As genealogists we appreciate how special an experience it is to walk where one's ancestors once did. No matter how near or far, east or west, it is exploring our family roots that brings us as fellow researchers memorable and unique connections.
