
Thank you for your faith in me these past, rewarding, six years.





John Milton Hayes January 16, 1937 – July 30, 2024

John Hayes passed away on July 30, 2024, heeding the call for an extra man to fill another square in "Square Dance Heaven". He was born on January 16,1937 at Memorial Hospital in Sedro Woolley, WA to John Spencer Hayes and Irene Margaret (Baller) Hayes. He was raised in Acme along with his two sisters, Gloria (1938) and Bonnie (1944), and brother Robert (1947)

John graduated from Mt. Baker High School in 1955 where he was student body president and class salutatorian.

John graduated in 1959 from the University of Washington with a B.S. in Civil Engineering. He worked for WSDOT after graduation. After six months with the National Guard at Fort Irwin, CA he returned to Seattle in 1960 to work again for the WSDOT.

John and Mary Ellen Aasen were married in Seattle on March 11, 1962. They moved to Rose Hill near Kirkland in 1963. They had two daughters, Kathi Ann born 1963 and Kristi Marie born 1966.

He became a project engineer in 1965 after obtaining his professional engineering license. His first field office was in Kirkland. John and his family moved to Mount Vernon in March 1975. He supervised the Mount Vernon office and a satellite office in Bellingham for over 18 years. John retired as the Assistant Regional Construction Engineer in Shoreline in 1995, after 35 years with the department.

He took square dance lessons in 1985. At a square dance he met and later married Rose Marie (Mattson) Clemetson on February 14, 1991, in Reno, Nevada.

John was active with his class reunion committee and was as the chairman for the Mt. Baker 51+ Alumni Reunion group. He met his Acme Elementary school classmates for breakfast monthly through July 2024.

John was active in the local Skagit Valley Genealogical society board, Mt, Baker Singles Square Dance Club and Skagit Squares. John continued square dancing up to the time of his passing. He was an avid fan of the Huskies and the local sports teams, the Seahawks, Mariners, and the Super Sonics.

John is survived by his wife Rosie, his sisters Gloria (James Beach) and Bonnie Olson, brother Robert Hayes (Dorothy) two daughters

Kathi (John Hicks) and Kristi Hayes Lindquist (Jeff North) and three grandchildren, Michael Hicks, Michelle Rorie (Alec) and Nicole

Larsen, and two great grandchildren, Oliver, and Rae Ann along with many nieces and nephews.
