She served as Secretary to the Washington State Genealogy Society for two years and was actively involved locally in the Skagit Valley Society, serving as Secretary for four years, and Education chair for four years until her health became an issue and she was not comfortable with continuing in that role, although for two years after that she continued to teach genealogy classes, her latest in February of this year. Her goal in the society was to teach others to research and compile their family histories. As a teacher, she loved to teach.

In most recent years, Iona has spent endless hours quilting for hospice patients, family and friends. She completed two



Freedom Quilts, and assisted with several other quilts, that were presented to the local families of military personnel who lost their lives in the Iraq war. She has over the past few years generously donated several quilts and other items for raffle by SVGS.

In April of 2007 she was honored by receiving a recognition award from WSGS when her name was submitted by SVGS for her contributions to that society.

She was an active member of the Crimson Sisterhood Red Hatters of Mount Vernon.


Iona will be missed. She had a cheerful spirit and a positive attitude, especially about her everyday activities and her health issues, attending meetings and special events with her oxygen in tow.





#### Proposed By-laws Revisions

The Board of Directors has approved the following revisions to the Skagit Valley Genealogical Society's By-laws to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting, Tuesday, October 23, 2007. This is in accordance with the By-laws, Article XII-Amendments, Section A, 3: "All such proposed amendments, together with the recommendations of the Board of Directors, shall be mailed to the membership at least 21 days prior to the Annual Meeting."

#### **Proposed By-laws Revisions**

<u>Name:</u> Article I: *change* "the following identification number" to "the following identification numbers"; *add* <u>IRS ID#91-1359846</u> at end of the sentence.

<u>Membership and Dues:</u> Article III, Section A, 1: *change* "shall be eligible for membership" to "shall be a member".

<u>Meetings:</u> Article IV, C, 1: change "The regular meeting in October shall be know as" to "shall be know<u>n</u> as"

<u>Board of Directors:</u> Article VI, Section B: add to "The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers of the Society, chairpersons (chairs) of standing committees" and special committees.

Duties of Officers: Article VII, D, 5: change "The Treasurer shall Act as chair of the Finance and Budget Committee, and with appointed assistants, present a budget for approval at the May Board meeting and at the Annual Meeting" to <u>"The Treasuer shall act</u> as chair of the Finance Committee with appointed assistants, present a budget for approval at the October Board Meeting preceding the Annual Meeting and at the Annual Meeting."

<u>Standing Committees:</u> Article VIII, C, 1 (Membership Chair), f: delete "<u>Develop pro-</u> grams to increase membership;" then revise following sub-section letters "g" and "h" to "f" and "g".

C, 4, a: "Newsletter Editor shall be responsible for publishing, and mail the Society newsletter." *change* "mail" to "mailing".

The Washington State Genealogical Society decided to take on the project of indexing the Washington State 1910 Census. This census was not soundexed and has been a problem for many people with families who moved into the state and then seemed to disappear. It was decided to make an every name index and to include the age and birth place for each person. The enumeration district, page and line number was also collected for quick location on the microfilm. There are 39 Counties in Washington, and all counties have been completed. The index has been turned over to the Washington Secretary of State Historical Records (Digital Archives) website.



# Upper Skagit Creek **Nearing Cemetery**
